Start 10:00am

Class 1 50cm Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 50cms, XC (rustic) 50cms, SJ max 55cms. Not timed
Horse and Rider combinations must not have been placed more than 3 times at 70cms SJ or WH

Class 2 60cm Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 65cm, XC (rustic) fences 60cm, SJ max 65cm
SJ not timed, XC 350 mpm

Horse and rider combination must not have been placed in 80cms show jumping or working hunter

Class 3 70cm Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 75cm, XC (rustic) fences 70cm, SJ max 75cm
SJ not timed, XC 350 mpm.

Horse and rider combination must not have been placed in 90cms show jumping or working hunter

Class 4 80cm Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 85cm, XC (rustic) fences 80cm, SJ max 85cm
SJ not timed, XC 350 mpm.

Class 5 90cm Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 95cm, XC (rustic) fences 90cm, SJ max 95cm
SJ not timed, XC 375 mpm.

Class 6 1m Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 1.05m, XC (rustic) fences 1m, SJ max 1.05m
SJ not timed, XC 375 mpm.

Class 7 1.10m Open Jumping Horse or Pony

3 phases of jumping, SJ Fences max 1.10m, XC (rustic) fences 1.05m, SJ max 1.10m
SJ not timed, XC 400 mpm. .

Entries on the day

Rules and regulations

1. Rosettes will be awarded for 1st to 6th place.
2. Classes are open to Horses and Ponies – Horse distances will apply. .
3. Competitors can wear show jackets or xc colours, no jumps will be fixed.
4. The wearing of body protectors is recommended
5. The competition will consist of a course of approx. 8 show jumps including a double. This will be followed by a timed phase with 6 – 8 Working Hunter fences which may include a bounce, angle, corner, skinny etc followed by another 8 show jump fences

The competitor will complete the show jumping course and will proceed immediately into the Working Hunter phase, followed by second show jump phase. The Show jumping starts with a whistle, competitors continue to the first Working Hunter fence timing will start on passing the start marker and stop on completing the WH phase competitors continue onto second show jump phase

6. The penalties will be scored as per table below for both show jumping and cross country phases. In the event of equal scores, the competitor nearest the optimum time will take the higher placing

Penalties for each section (SJ & WH)	
Knockdown	4 penalties
1 st disobedience	4 penalties
2 nd disobedience	8 penalties
3 rd disobedience	Elimination
Fall of rider	8 penalties
2 nd fall of rider	Elimination
Fall of Horse	Compulsory Retirement
Retaking an obstacle already jumped	Elimination
Every commenced second in excess of time allowed	1 penalty
Exceeding time limit (3 x time allowed)	Elimination

7. In the event of equal scores, the competitor closest to the optimum time will take the higher placing.
8. The committee reserves the right to alter, divide or cancel any of the classes, and to transfer entries, which in their opinion are in the wrong class, with or without giving a reason.

9. Findon Riding Club will not be held responsible for any complaint regarding horses or ponies entered in the wrong class, but will act as a mediator provided the complainant has proof on the day of the show.
10. At or in the vicinity of any Findon Riding Club event, everyone mounted, whether competing or not must wear a hard hat conforming to the minimum safety standards, with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination of the horse and/or rider from the competition. Hats marked PAS 015 or prefixed with ASTM or SEI are the minimum standard allowed. Recommended hard hats should carry the quality assurance stamp of Kitemark or SEI. American standard SNELL E95 and Australian/New Zealand standard SNZ 3838 1998 are also acceptable. Where a hat is of skull cap style, this must be worn with a silk.
11. Disclaimer of liability – save for death or personal injury caused by negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the British Horse Society, nor the agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury, or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.
